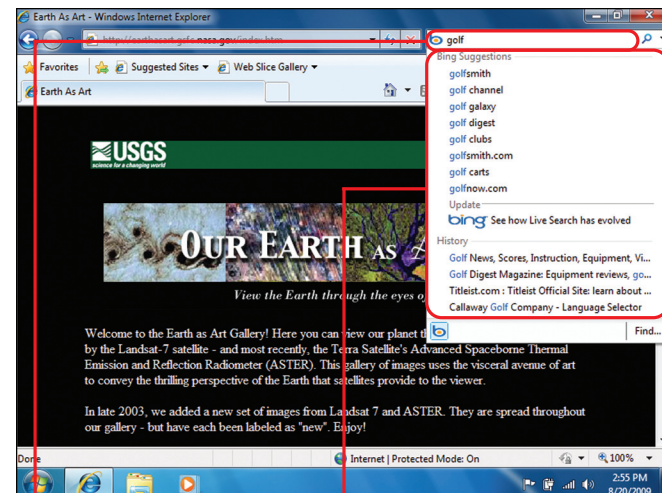


You can search for webpages that discuss topics of interest to you.

Websites that allow you to search for information on the web are known as search providers. Internet Explorer uses Bing to search for information on the web. You can add other search providers, such as Google and Yahoo!, to your list of available search providers.

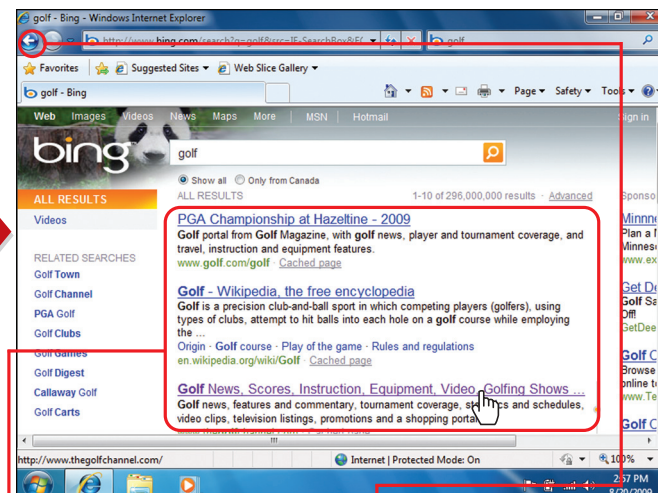


SEARCH THE WEB



1 Click this area and then type the word or phrase you want to search for. Press the **Enter** key to start the search.

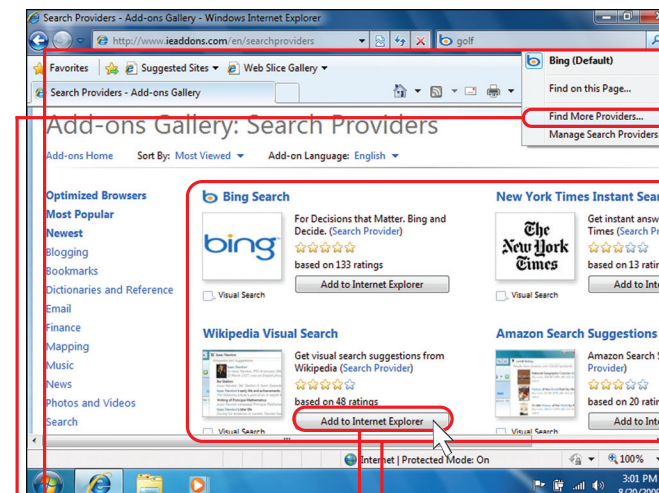
As you type, a list of search suggestions appears as well as a list of matching webpages that you have recently viewed. If you want to use a search suggestion to perform the search or display a webpage on the list, click the item.



A list of matching webpages appears.
2 To display a webpage of interest, click the title of the webpage.

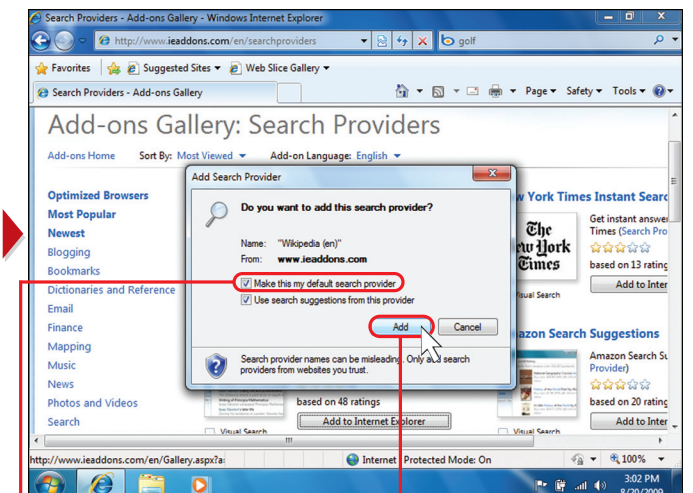
The webpage you selected will appear.
You can click **Back** to return to the list of webpages and select another page.

ADD A SEARCH PROVIDER



1 To add a search provider that you can use to perform your searches, click **Find More Providers**.
2 Click **Find More Providers**.

A webpage appears, displaying search providers that you can add.
3 When you see a search provider that you want to add, click **Add to Internet Explorer** beside the provider.



The Add Search Provider dialog box appears.
4 If you want to use the search provider for all of your searches, click this option to make the provider your default search provider (☐ changes to ☒.

5 Click **Add** to add the search provider.
6 To add additional search providers, repeat steps 3 to 5 for each search provider.
