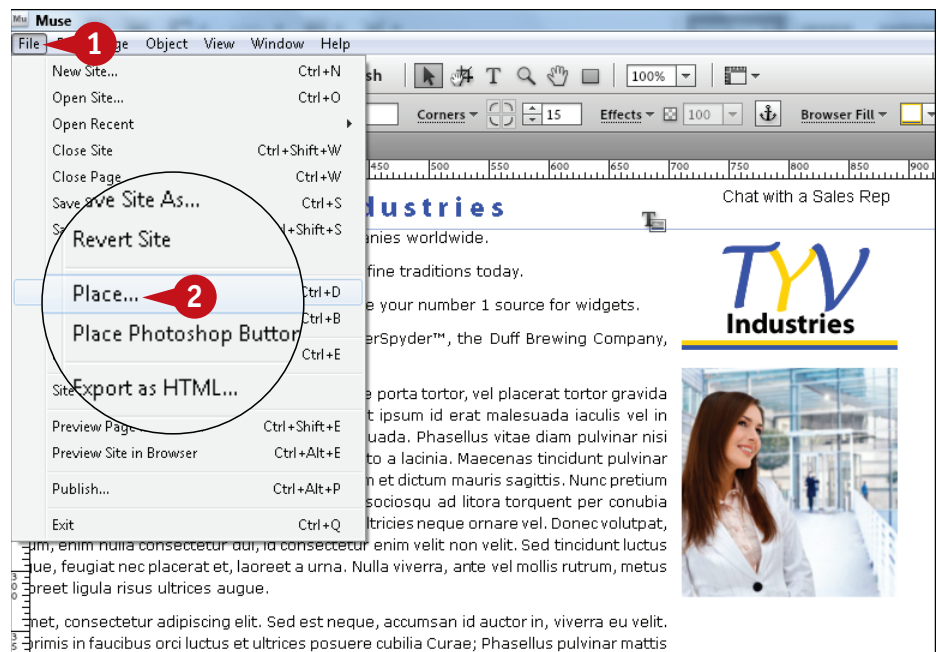


Place Photoshop Images

If you create your images in Fireworks or Illustrator or another similar program, you must be sure to convert the image to JPEG, GIF, or PNG first. If on the other hand you use Photoshop, you can place the native PSD file into your Muse document. You can then have Muse merge the image's layers or import selected layers. Once placed, the Photoshop image looks and acts just like any other image you have on your page.

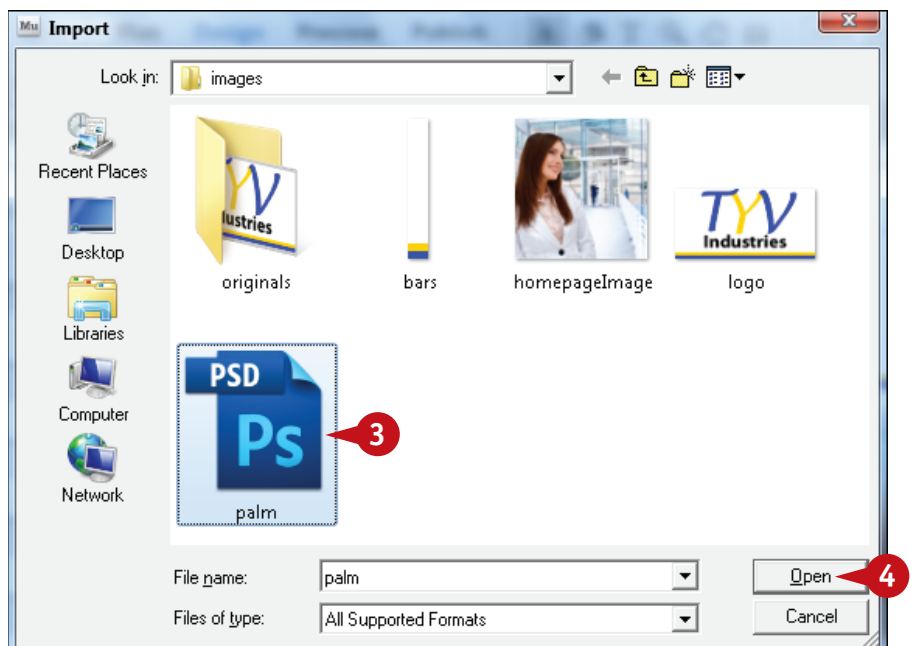
Place Photoshop Images

- 1 Click **File**.
- 2 Click **Place**.



The Import dialog box opens.

- 3 Select the PSD file you want to import.
- 4 Click **Open**.



The Image Import Options dialog box appears.

- 5 Choose either to import a composite image or select one or more layers to import (○ changes to ●).

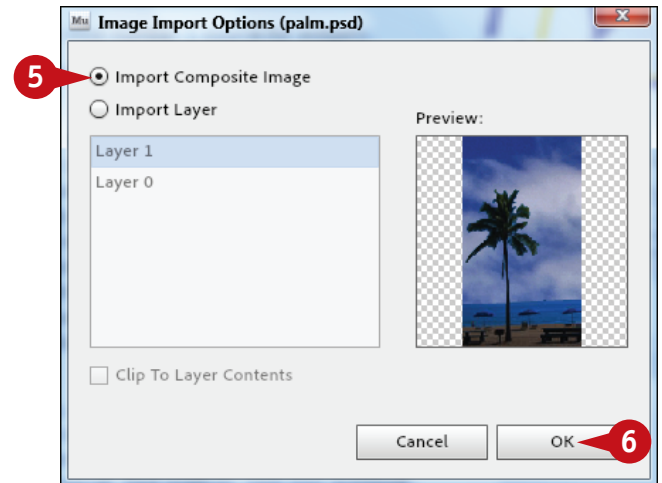
Note: Press and hold **Shift** to select multiple adjacent layers, or **Ctrl** (⌘ on a Mac) for multiple non-adjacent layers.

- 6 Click **OK**.

The place gun appears.

- 7 Either click to place the image at its native size, or click and drag to set a size for the image.

The image is placed in the document.



TIPS

When I publish the site, will the native Photoshop image be on the web?

No. When you publish, Muse converts your image to a JPEG or PNG file, using a set of default optimization settings. Your PSD file remains on your hard drive. At this time, you do not have any way to control the final format or the optimization of the image.

When might I choose to import a composite Photoshop image, and when might I want selected layers only?

If you want the complete, finished Photoshop image, you want to import a composite image. If, however, there are portions of the image or effects in the image that you do not want to show on the website, you could select only those layers that have the information you want and exclude the rest.
