



How to get and use your

Login with Amazon

Client ID

Step 1 : Access your Amazon Payments Merchant Account and select Login with Amazon from the dropdown list.

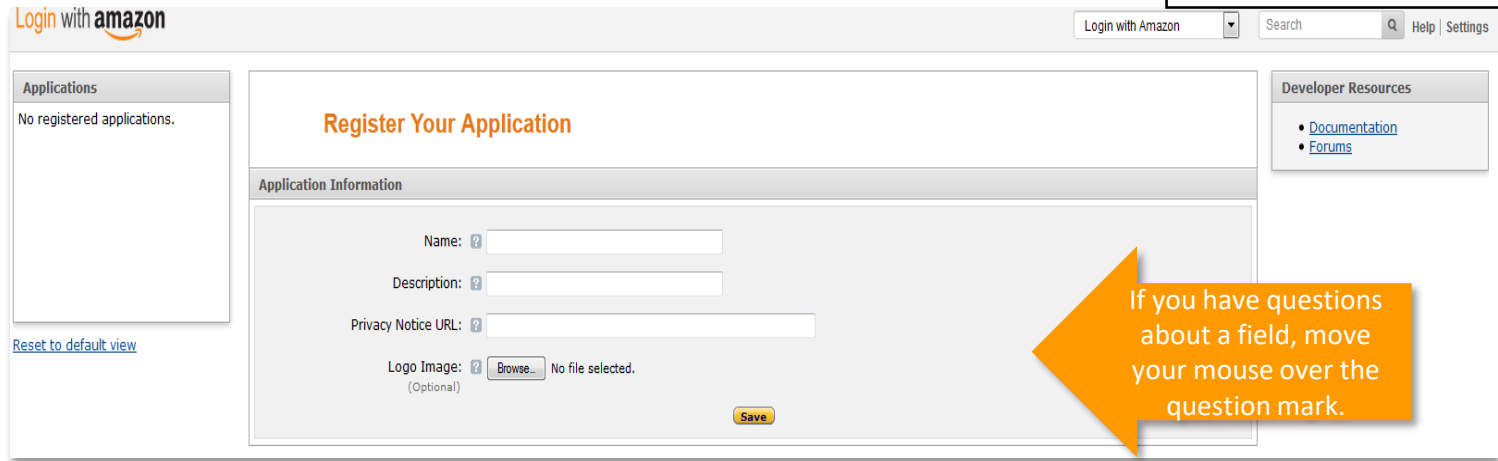

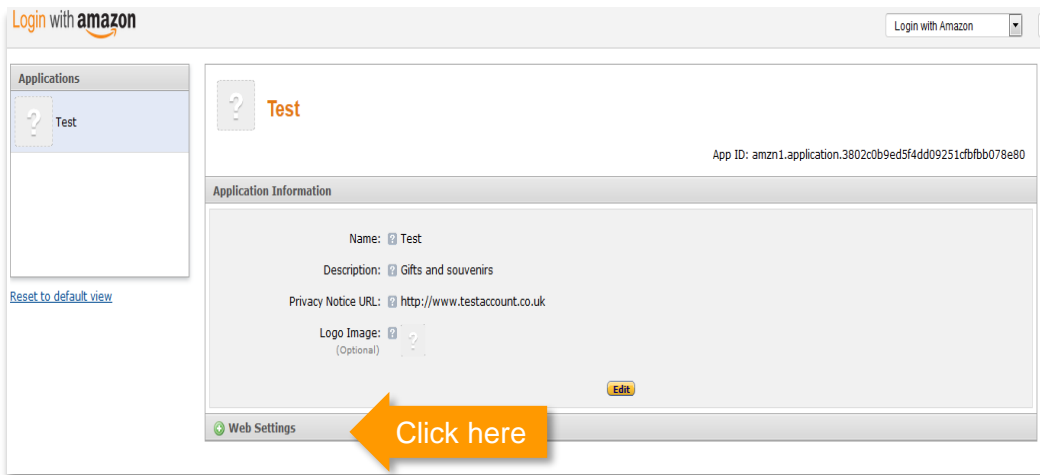
Step 3 : Fill in your website details and click “Save”. All text fields must be populated.

No field should be left empty, otherwise you will get an error message upon saving

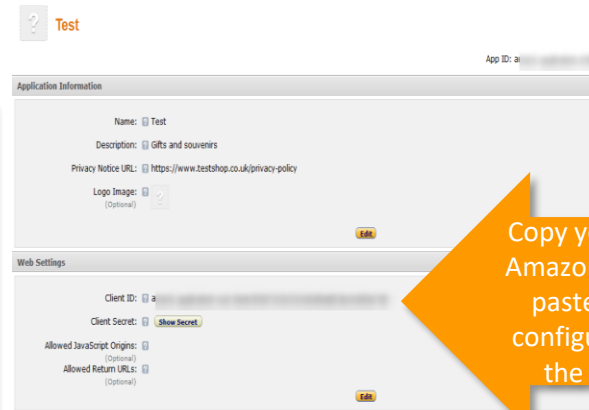


If you have questions about a field, move your mouse over the question mark.

Copy your Login with Amazon Client ID and paste it into your configuration during the integration

Make sure you don't use the **App-ID** or the **Client Secret** instead.

Step 5 : Add your Allowed JavaScript origins and Return URLs

Here you can find your Login with Amazon Client ID, which you must enter in the configuration of your *Login with Amazon* and *Amazon Pay* integration.

In any case, you must store here all URLs to the domains on which the *Login with Amazon* and *Amazon Pay* button will be available. You may only enter **https** URLs here. Without a **valid SSL certificate**, the buttons will not work. Only localhost can be used with http, but for Sandbox testing, a self signed certificate can also be used.

If you use the **redirect method** in your shop for user login, you must specify also the return URLs. These are all the URLs of the pages on which the customer is redirected after a successful login.

Once you have completed this step by clicking on the Save button, you can use *Amazon Pay* in your shop.

Step 6 : Go back to the Amazon Payments –UK (Sandbox view) by clicking the toggle on the top right
