11 Tips To Make The Best Use Of Your Duct Tape

1. Use a sharp knife when cutting duct tape because using scissors will make the scissors sticky and ripping by hand will leave the duct tape with a rough edge.
2. Duct tape sticks to many things, including duct tape! After tearing or cutting off a piece of tape from the roll, fold over the end of the remaining tape onto itself to make it easier to find and grab the end next time.
3. Keep your duct tape in an easily accessible place, which might mean that you keep a roll in your kitchen, basement, garage, or workshop... or all of the above.
4. Remove lint or pet hair from upholstery and clothing by cutting or tearing off a piece of duct tape from the roll and pressing the adhesive side against the surface with unwanted particles, then peeling it away.
5. Organize cables and cords by cutting or tearing off a piece of duct tape from the roll and wrapping it around bundles of cables to reduce the clutter.
6. Remove sticker residue by cutting or tearing off a piece of duct tape from the roll and pressing the adhesive side against the surface with unwanted residue, then peeling it away.
7. Create a heavy duty lint roller by wrapping duct tape around a paint roller with the adhesive side out.
8. When cutting a piece of wood with a saw, keep the wood from splintering by sticking a piece of duct tape onto the wood where you plan to make the cut, then removing the tape afterward.
9. Wrap duct tape around a hammer, screwdriver, or other tool handle that is difficult to grip.
10. Take a roll of duct tape on your camping trip to make quick repairs to a tent, hammock, folding chair, or backpack.
11. Prevent a ladder, scaffolding, saw horses, or work table from damaging a surface by wrapping the ends / feet with duct tape... or by covering the surface with pieces of duct tape for protection.
